Minimum Credit Requirements Per Year

Full year courses @ 5 credits

- *Sciences 5, 6 or 7 cr.*
- *Double period electives 10 cr.*
- *Cooperative Education 15 cr.*

Semester courses @ 2.5 credits

- *2 semester classes = 1 full year*

High School - **35 credits**

- 7 full year classes (9 periods = 1 lunch + 8 classes)

Middle School

- 8 periods plus lunch which includes 2 electives

College Accelerated Program (CAP)

- ❑ **Dual Credit** program with Burlington County Community College where students can capitalize on the classes they are currently enrolled in that qualify for college credit.
- ❑ Instructors of the approved courses will go over the information with students early in the school year.
- ❑ Students can pick up the application in the Office of Academics (West Counseling Office)



National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA)



- There are 3 Divisions at the Collegiate Level.
 - **Each has their own set of rules for eligibility.**
 - *Division I (Scholarship)*
 - Complete 16 core courses
 - *Minimum GPA/SAT requirement on slide scale*
 - *Division II (Scholarship)*
 - Complete 14 core courses
 - *Minimum Core GPA: 2.000 and*
 - *Minimum SAT score: 820 (Critical Reading/Math) or*
 - *Minimum ACT sum score: 68*
 - *Division III (No Athletic Scholarships)*
 - *No need to qualify through NCAA*
