Grades are recorded numerically on both the report card and transcript.

CLASS RANK/GRADE POINT AVERAGE

- Numerical average is the means of calculating class rank (rounded to three decimal places).
- All courses are included in the G.P.A. and this determines class rank.
- Seven points are added to the final grade of all honors and A.P. Courses. The weighted grades are used for ranking purposes and are not reflected on the report card or transcript. No weight is added to a failing grade.
- A 91.0 average is required at the conclusion of the 5th semester to be eligible academically for consideration for membership in the National Honor Society.

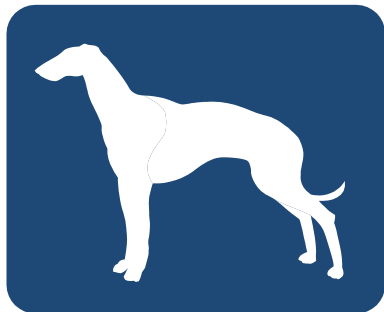
